There will also be a full slate of one-shot afternoon workshops including things like outdoor activities, games, discussions groups (on topics ranging from personal finance to alternative relationship models to how the conference works), and much, much more.

Spring is held at Camp Glen Brook,
35 Glenbrook Road, Marlborough, NH

Get to route 101 in Marlborough NH. Once you're in Marlborough follow the directions below (googlemaps, etc. will tend to send you down a barely maintained dirt road instead of this more useable route).

Turn off 101 onto Roxbury Rd. (Left about 1/2 mile beyond the blinking light and the Shell station if coming from the west, right after Lee & Mt. Fuji Restaurant if coming from the east. Sign on a granite post for Glen Brook). Proceed over the river and up the hill 0.4 mile to a fork (GB sign) and bear left onto Horse Hill Rd. Follow this another 0.4 mile. Take first left (GB sign) onto Glenbrook Rd. Go up the hill, the driveway to Camp Glen Brook is on the right. Look for the big white house.
